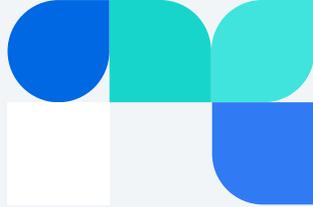

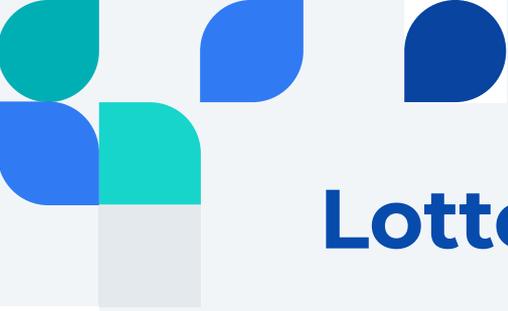

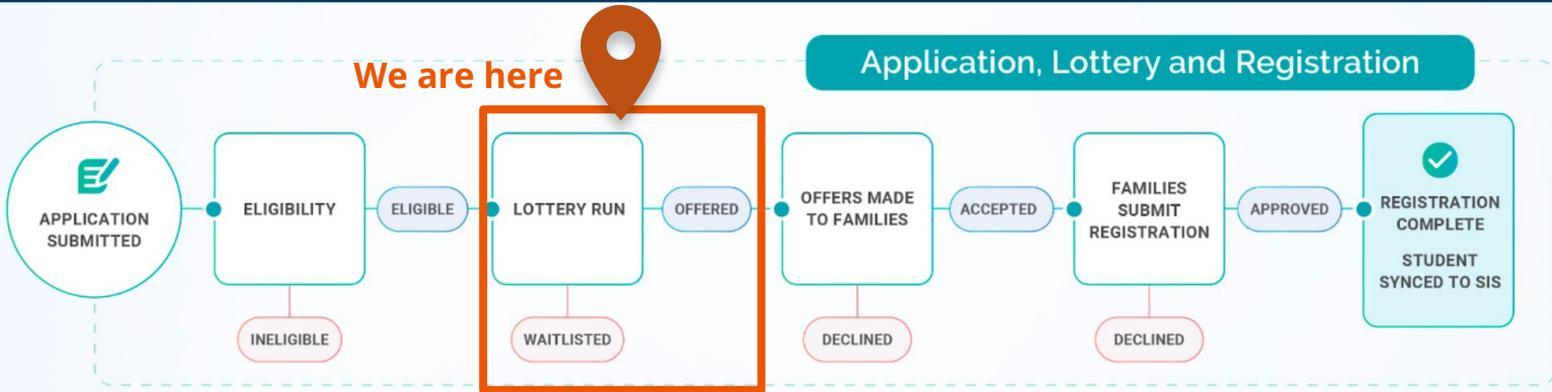
Lottery Module in SchoolMint

When there are more students who want to attend a school/program than there are seats available, a lottery will be run. A lottery is a fair and equitable placement process orgs will utilize to place students who want to attend their school(s).

For most organizations, there will be a single application window, the lottery will be run, and then students offered seats will accept/decline and continue on to register at the school (either within Enroll or utilizing the school's external registration process).

Lotteries will vary from very simple to very complicated. Every organization's lottery process can and will be different, so it's important to understand all the different ways a lottery can run and function.

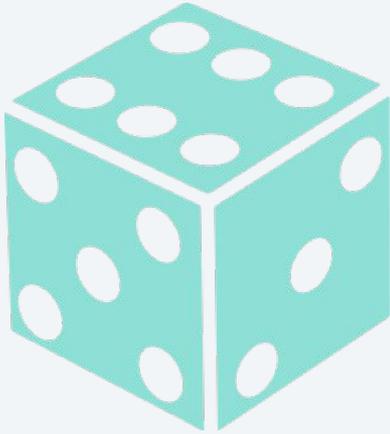

Lottery Priorities



Lottery: Priorities

Settings > Manage Lotteries > Lottery Priorities



Priorities are used to give students a **higher chance** to be placed on the offered list. They determine where a student's application sits **relative to others**, and how "high" on the list that student is placed. Students with priorities are **more likely** to get into a school/program when the lottery is run, or will sit higher on the waitlist if there is no space left on the offered list.

Manual vs. Automatic Priorities

Manual:

Applied manually by the admin to an application during the review process. This is usually done when there is more scrutiny required when awarding this priority.



Automatic:

Automatically assigned for students who meet the corresponding criteria. Can be calculated by the system using student data tied to questions on the application



Create a Priority

1. Go to Settings > Manage Lotteries > Lottery Priorities
2. Click on Add New Priority
3. Configure the settings outlined in the screenshot below

If Enabled: Allows configuration of logic with rules engine

Allow Override

If Enabled: Allows admins to override logic of automatic priority

Clear on Roll Over

If Enabled: Priority won't carry over into next school year

Configure an Automatic Priority

The rules engine is used to create priority eligibility rules that automatically set these priorities as eligible for students who meet the specified criteria. If the student data matches the rule, then the student is eligible for the priority.

Simple Lookup allows you to choose the Field Name, Operator, and Expected value. For example, the priority above is going to be assigned to any student where the Zip Code is 70506



Oprah's Favorite Lottery Priorities: Siblings

This is a common lottery priority used by many of our organizations

Use our Sibling Condition for Siblings Attending, and/or Siblings Applying. Sibling Applying is assigned as long as the students have a submitted application under the same guardian account. Sibling Attending is assigned through the Sibling step on the application form

Use our Student Address Condition if you have boundary files on your platform. You can prioritize students inside and/or outside of specific district, or school zones. No boundary files? No worries! As long as you are collecting address data, you can create one for State, City, or Zip!

Oprah's Favorite Lottery Priorities: None!

Sometimes, you don't need a priority lottery. Here is what you can do:

You will want to ensure that the "priority" is something that can apply to ALL students. You can do this by creating a priority that applies to all applications that are marked as eligible. Students will then receive the "No Priority" priority on their eligible applications.

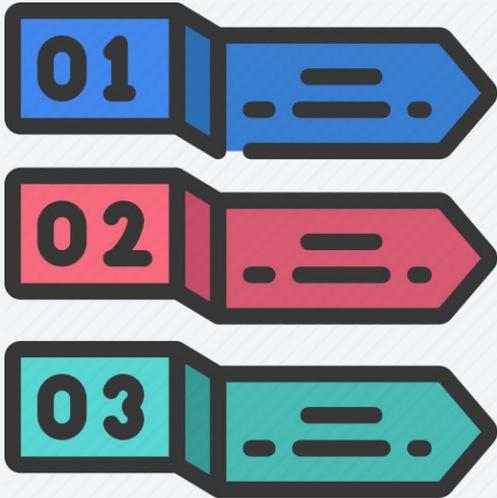

Lottery: Designs

Settings > Manage Lotteries > Lottery Designs



While the priority is used to give the student's application a higher chance of placement, the sub-lottery that the priority is assigned to, along with the rules (entries, weights, quotas, etc.) in the lottery design, will drive where the student is actually placed on the lottery list.

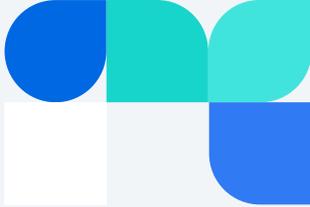
I'll take Tiered vs. Weighted for 200, Alex!

Tiered:

Assigns an **Entries** amount for each priority included in a **sub-lottery**. An application whose **highest priority has more entries** than other applications **in that same sub-lottery** will have an **increased chance** of being placed above the others. Entries **do not guarantee a higher placement**, they just increase the chances of higher placement **within a sub-lottery**.

Weighted:

Assigns a **Weight** for each priority included in a **sub-lottery**. An application whose **highest priority has more weights** than other applications **in that same sub-lottery** will **always be placed above** other applications with a lower weight priority. Priority weight dictates the ordering of applications **within a sub-lottery**. Applications with **equal weight** priorities **within the same sub-lottery** will be **randomly ordered**.



Let's Look At Some Examples

Tiered Lottery

Think of entries as tickets in the (sub-lottery 1) metaphorical hat.

The Employee Child application has 4 more chances than the Board Member's 1 chance, but the Employee Child application is not guaranteed to get placed above the Board Member application

During the lottery execution, the randomization within the sub-lottery could pull the Board Member's 1 entry/ticket out of the hat before getting to any of the 4 entries/tickets for the Employee Child

Weighted Lottery

Weights will typically be placed in a highest weight to lowest weight order

The application with the Employee Child priority with a weight of 4 will always be ordered above applications with the Sibling Attending or Board Member priorities with weights of 1.

Applications with either the Sibling Attending or the Board Member priority in this sub-lottery will be randomly ordered against each other, but always after applications with the Employee child priority.

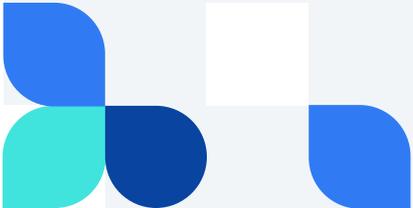

- Auto-decline **APPLICATIONS if OFFER** is not accepted by:
Days After Published Offer: 10 and/or Date*: 01/31/2025 at Time of Day: 10:00 AM
If the "Days After Published Offer" extends past the date in the "Date" field, then the auto-decline occurs on the earlier of the two dates.
- Auto-decline **APPLICATIONS if REGISTRATION** is not submitted by:
Days After Accepting Seat: 10 and/or Date*: 01/31/2025 at Time of Day: 05:00 PM
If the "Days After Accepting Seat" extend past the date in the "Date" field, then the auto-decline occurs on the earlier of the two dates.

These options affect auto-decline settings:

- Send a reminder email/text message to warn guardians before auto-decline
Days Before Auto-Decline*: 1 at Time of Day: 10:00 AM
- Exclude weekends

Waiting List

- To-roll up applications from waiting list to offered list (when another application on offered list is declined)
- Roll over waiting lists when the school year is rolled over

Post Lottery

- Auto-add eligible applications to lottery list after initial lottery is run

General

- Place Multiples Together
Same parent account & grade level required. Does not affect score-based lotteries.
- Same Address
- Twin Setting (same birthday ±1 day)

Review each setting carefully to align with your desired lottery settings!



Note: If you have auto-decline on execution, you will want to make sure to have auto-rollup on to fill your seats

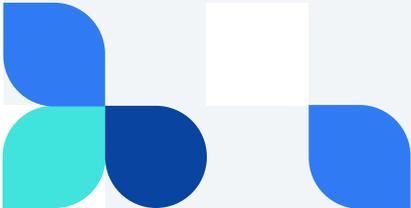

Common reasons an Application was not placed:

1. Submission date outside of the range used on lottery run
2. Application not set as eligible before lottery run
3. Grade/Program not included in the lottery run

Troubleshoot: Guardian Notifications

In your lottery list, you can determine if a guardian has been notified of their student's placement using a Saved View that includes their Notification Timestamps

Partially Published Lottery?

This means that there is a student on your lottery list who has not been notified yet! When you publish again, it will only notify those newly placed students, or students whose placements have changed and have not been notified!

Tip: Review your results thoroughly before publishing to ensure there results are accurate!

Troubleshoot: Student Placed On The Wrong List

Sometimes students applied to the wrong grade or program, and need to be moved

1. To remove the student's application from the incorrect lottery list, **Withdraw** the student application, and put the reason for withdrawal (applied to wrong grade/program, etc.)
2. **Update** the withdrawn student's grade, or whatever made them ineligible to be placed in the lottery, and ensure that their correct program is selected in the **Choice Selection step**
3. Go to the **Review and Send step**, and click Submit Application to **re-submit** the form with the change
4. In the **Application** module, if necessary, **update the submission date/time**, and update the application status to **Eligible**
 - a. If you have **Auto-Add** turned on, they will automatically be added to the lottery list and you can adjust their placement
 - b. If you do not have **Auto-Add** turned on, you will need to run a merged lottery

Note: Be aware that if you have auto-rollup turned on, when you withdraw the form, a student will roll up into that available seat!

Q: Can you give another example of when you would use "make entries cumulative"?

A: Cumulative lotteries are used when you want your priorities within a sub lottery to be able to "stack" for students who meet more than one priority. In a tiered lottery, a student who has more than one priority (if entries are cumulative) receives more entries. In a weighted lottery, if they have more than one priority, they would receive a higher weight.

Q: Auto-decline if a student's other applications are on the waitlist do those also auto-decline?

A: This can be managed under Settings > Manage Lotteries > Lottery Settings > By Form Process

Q: Auto Decline applications if registration--is this functionality retroactive? Ex. a student has been sitting in accepted and not started registration can it auto-decline

A: The expiration date is set at the time of the lottery offer. So you can update the date/time but it will not apply retroactively, only to new offers

Q: Waitlists: For Auto-roll up applications from waitlists to offered list option is check, if an application moves off waitlist to offer list, applicant is also on other waitlists, once they accept the offer seat, will they be removed from the other waitlists?

A: This can be managed under Settings > Manage Lotteries > Lottery Settings > By Form Process

Q: What if we don't see under the programs all the Lottery Settings that you just shared?	A: If you don't see a Lottery Setting that is available in your Program Lottery Settings, it may be that it is not turned on in your Global Settings. If it is turned on in Global, you may want to check your Admin's Permissions
Q: What if you run multiple lotteries? Does Not placed lottery list update?	A: The expected behavior is that this updates.
Q: Will admins ever be able to manually place students without auto-add or running new lotteries?	A: This is on our roadmap of features we would love to add! If you would like to put in a feature request, check out our Community - our Product Team reviews this and other admins can upvote this request.
Q: Lottery was ran, parent accepted, but register button is grayed out. how can resolve this?	A: This may be due to Registration Dates being closed. You can navigate to Settings > Date & Time > Click to Manage for Each School Level > Update Your Dates. You also have the ability to use School Specific Dates, so ensure that your dates are also open in your schools by going to Settings > Schools/Programs > Manage Schools > Edit > Registration Settings tab
Q: If a lottery is run and students are offered seats and another lottery is run, will the second run ever replace the seats from the first run?	A: The system will never be remove a student from an offered list automatically. The only time a student will be removed from an offered list is if an admin manually adjusts their placement within the lottery list, or their application is withdrawn
